

Workington

The Workington Heritage Transport Group has been hard at work creating their wonderful award-winning floral displays again this year. Passengers will see a selection of flowers, strawberries and herbs at the station.



Hexham

A scheme run by community group Transition Tynedale, Edible Hexham provides tubs of herbs, fruit and vegetables on the station which members of the public are invited to pick when they are ripe.



Esk Valley Herb Line

The Esk Valley line, which runs between Middlesbrough and Whitby, is also known as the Esk Valley Herb Line. Each station has a box full of fresh herbs ready to be picked.



Maryport

Station adoption group 'The Maryporters' has worked closely with Community Rail Cumbria to create a Roman themed garden at Maryport. The Roman troughs show an array of flowers and herbs that were brought over to Great Britain as part of the invasions.



Bingley

There's a wonderful selection of herbs growing in this beautiful train shaped planter at Bingley station, looked after by volunteers.



Poppleton

Poppleton Community Railway Nursery is Britain's last surviving railway nursery and its history is rooted in the 1880s. It is run by volunteers who grow flowers and vegetables for the community to buy.

Green Road Station

The service users and staff at charity Turning Point have created a community garden where you can find strawberries, raspberries and blueberries to eat.



Todmorden

The team at Todmorden help grow fruit, herbs and vegetables around the station for everyone to share.



Garforth

Garforth station is home to a very special planter - designed to look like a Northern train made from recycled wood. The Garforth Express is full of veggie goodies for anyone to sample.



Hindley

Thanks to Friends of Hindley Station and Thrive CIC, Hindley has a whole host of herbs and vegetables growing - including garlic, onions, peas, broad beans, and strawberries.



Romiley

Platform 1 is home to a herb planter which also contains delicious Alpine strawberries.

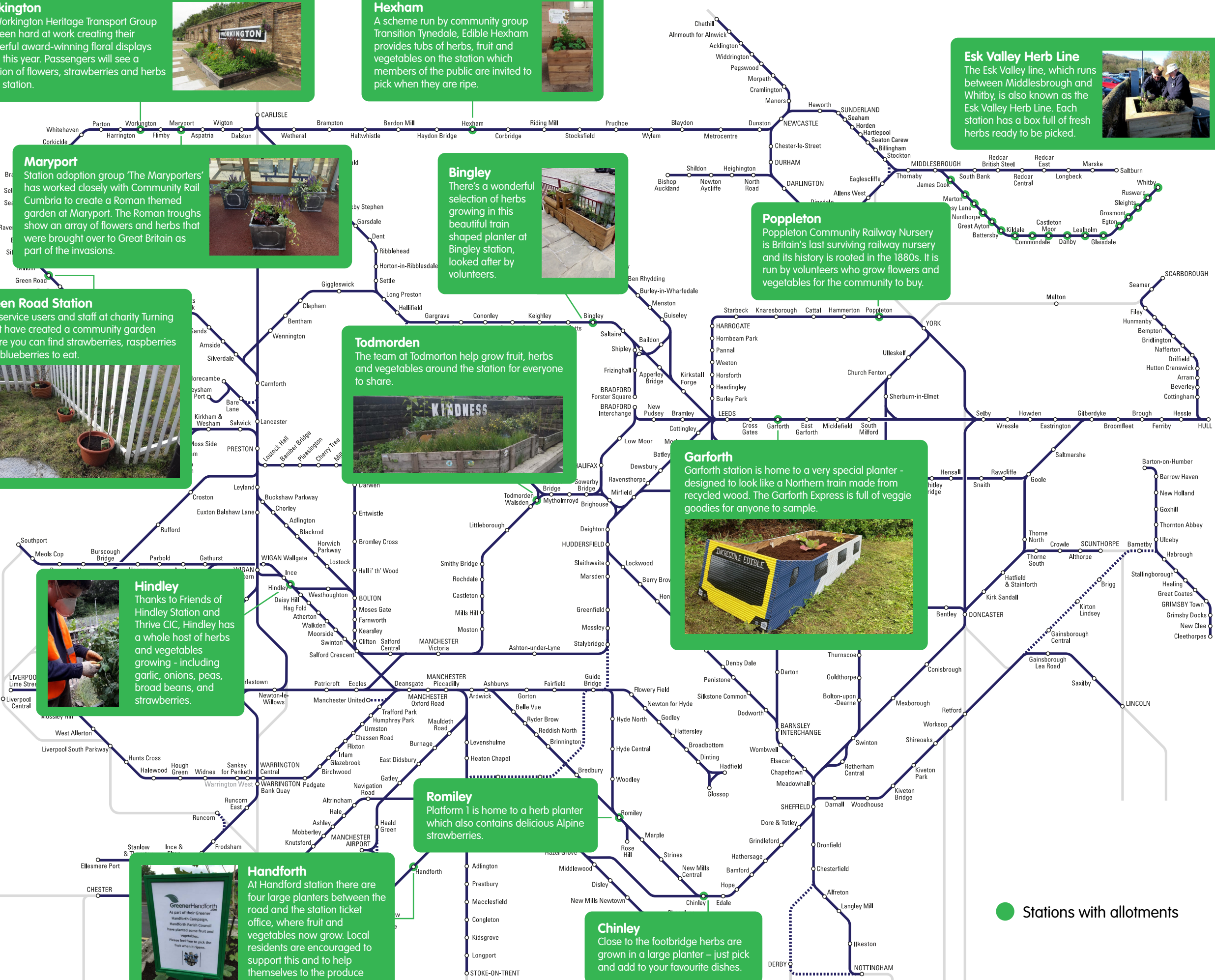
Handforth
